Whereas Thomas Bland and Danoras his wife exhibited their bill of Complaint
 the thirteenth day of June anno Domini thousand six hundred seventy eight against
 Edward Dorsey and Sarah his wife and others in his High and Honorable Court of
 Chancery of this Province, whereby setting forth, that the said Danoras of this County
 was the Heir and Exr of Nicholas Wyatt of Chum Chumdel County deceased,
 that the said Dorsey writt the Inventory amounting unto One hundred forty
 five thousand four hundred twenty three pounds of tobacco and included more goods
 then belonged to Wyatt that Danoras intrusted Dorsey with Wyatts Estate
 during the Voyage Shipp who in that time converted and misd of the said Wyatts
 goods to his own use, that Danoras Com for the will to be pronounced the first
 day of September One thousand six hundred seventy six Doves out Letters of
 Administration in his own name and exhibited an Inventory amounting unto Eighty
 thousand pounds of tobacco, and disposed of summe of the said Wyatts goods
 that the plaintiffs and Defendants the Death day of April Anno One thousand
 six hundred seventy seven Entered into Bond of Arbitration of three hundred
 thousand pounds of Tobacco to stand to the arbitration of Colm Taylor and
 Colm George to Arbitrate and divide the Estate of Wyatt between the ptes
 and Defendants, that the arbitrators made their award and ordered that Bland
 and his wife should in lieu of his wife's thirds possess and enjoy the plantation
 whereon his wife lived, that Bland should divide Dorsey's remainder
