 Defend<sup>t</sup>s his bonds of y<sup>e</sup> p<sup>t</sup>s of three hundred pound<sup>s</sup> of tobacco which they have put in suit  
 that these Defend<sup>t</sup>s entered upon y<sup>e</sup> plantation called Quarters and upon y<sup>e</sup> servants stock  
 and hogg and that there was about forty barrells of Corn and about thirty hoggs the  
 tobacco that these Defend<sup>t</sup>s retained the same and ought not to be accountable for  
 same to the Compt<sup>r</sup> Thomas, that these Defend<sup>t</sup>s cut down timber by ord<sup>r</sup> of the  
 Damoras, that they had possession delivered them by the Compt<sup>r</sup> Damoras and should  
 retain and ought not to be accountable to y<sup>e</sup> Compt<sup>r</sup>s, And denye they detain any pecuniary  
 or wearing apparel belonging to the Compt<sup>r</sup> Thomas, and that the Compt<sup>r</sup>s account exhibited  
 before y<sup>e</sup> Judge Discretary was set aside by y<sup>e</sup> award of Colonel Taylor and Colonel Dugge  
 and denye they possessed themselves of any part of the small estate more than what was delivered  
 And confesses y<sup>e</sup> Compt<sup>r</sup> tendered bills to the said Defend<sup>t</sup>s w<sup>ch</sup> were deposited & that these  
 Defend<sup>t</sup>s refused to allow y<sup>e</sup> same, that y<sup>e</sup> Compt<sup>r</sup>s M<sup>r</sup>anting a Woman servant did  
 Exchange a man servant named Worth to work for these Defend<sup>t</sup>s for long as the Woman  
 servant should stay and work w<sup>th</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Compt<sup>r</sup>s, and the said Woman servant belonging to  
 the said Compt<sup>r</sup> Thomas, the Compt<sup>r</sup> left with the Compt<sup>r</sup> Thomas his wife to run  
 her of a hoard logg, To which answer of the Defend<sup>t</sup>s there being much  
 more matter the Compt<sup>r</sup>s replyed specially and say. that the Defend<sup>t</sup>s by  
 sinister and fraudulent means caused the Compt<sup>r</sup> Damoras to sign and seale  
 severall papers the contents of which she never heard read, and utterly denye the  
 said receipts or releases in any way by Law discharge these Defend<sup>t</sup>s, that  
 the Compt<sup>r</sup> Thomas & his Edward submitted all differences to the Court their who  
 awarded the Defend<sup>t</sup> Edward to pay unto the Compt<sup>r</sup> Thomas seven thousand five  
 hundred forty six pound<sup>s</sup> of tobacco, that there was three thousand pound<sup>s</sup> of tobacco  
 more due upon y<sup>e</sup> account but by neglect of y<sup>e</sup> Compt<sup>r</sup> was omitted out of y<sup>e</sup> account  
 upon the Court<sup>r</sup>s award, and denye the said Defend<sup>t</sup>s paid y<sup>e</sup> said seven thousand  
 five hundred forty six pound<sup>s</sup> of tobacco to these Compt<sup>r</sup>s or either of them, that the  
 Defend<sup>t</sup>s inticed y<sup>e</sup> Compt<sup>r</sup> Damoras to give discharge for y<sup>e</sup> same, and denye the  
 receipt, can discharge the said bond, that the Compt<sup>r</sup>s exhibited their Just account  
 of Wyatts estate, after this will was found and upon Dorsey his owne Examin  
 hath allowed thirty eight thousand eight hundred and eighty pound<sup>s</sup> of tobacco  
 and denye the arbitrato<sup>r</sup>s have allowed by their award Justly the sume  
 found to the Defend<sup>t</sup>s answer amountes. that these Compt<sup>r</sup>s and Defend<sup>t</sup>s  
 entered into bonds of three thousand thousand pound<sup>s</sup> of tobacco to stand to the award  
 of Colonel Taylor and Colonel Burgess to decide y<sup>e</sup> difference concerning the  
 of Nicholas Wyatt and not otherwise and that they were not permitted to examine  
 any accounts before y<sup>e</sup> Arbitrato<sup>r</sup> nor that the said Compt<sup>r</sup>s Just account exhibit
