 particulars whereof are in a schedule to the answer annexed, that the
 Dfdo allow of Eighteen thousand two hundred and twenty five pounds of
 Tobacco Eighty nine thousand four hundred and thirty five pounds of Tob
 for goods delivered, for a servant named Blisset Eight hundred and
 of Tobacco amounting in all to the sum of One hundred and Eighty
 thousand five hundred and fifty pounds of Tobacco with deducted out of
 one hundred fifty four thousand three hundred and two pounds of Tob
 the Remainer forty six thousand five hundred and thirty five pounds of Tob
 with ought to be paid to the said Dfdo, Dreyer the Comps have proposed
 the said Award but that forty six thousand five hundred and thirty five pounds
 of Tobacco is free due, and that the Comps Demand contrary to the Award
 hath been the bond of One hundred thousand pounds of Tobacco due
 into by the Dfdo Edward which was all matters indifferent were settled
 by the last Award, that the Dfdo have performed the said Award
 and have paid the Comps Damoras for moiety of the personall State
 also for his debts in the Peace State as by Receipt under his hand
 date dated the nineteenth of January 1679 by the said Thomas
 Dlamis the State so as aforesaid and just the Dfdo, that the Comps
 desired the Dfdo to come and live with them and they provided for them
 from June 1674 till January following, that the Dfdo was by Award to
 pay the moiety of the Estate to the Comps Damoras and that the said
 Damoras refused to let the Dfdo pay the same to the Comps Thomas
 and that the Comps the Dfdo refused to pay the same, that the Comps
 Damoras and the Dfdo went to the house of Colou Burges for agents
 and Justice who in June 1674 by the priority and Consent of the Comps
 Thomas settled all his Peace and personall State upon Colou Burges
 by Deed, that the Arbitrat having respect to the said Deed Award
 the Dfdo to pay the moiety awarded to the Comps Damoras lob.
