the said land and personall estate for four thousand pounds of tobacco and
during her life and thirty thousand pounds of tobacco to whom she should
bequeath the same at her death and thereupon she discharged the said Deft, that
the Deft, gave her bond for seventy thousand pounds of tobacco, to pay the four
thousand pounds of tobacco and duties they possessed themselves of any
of the personall estate of the said Thomas or carried away any servants
belonging to the said Thomas, but confessed that the Chubertals delivered
the said Deft, the bond of the said Deft, for three hundred thousand pounds of
tobacco, with the help, in justice, that the said Deft, entered upon the planta-
tion called the Quartier and upon the servants stock and crops land that
there was about forty barrels of Corn and about thirty hogheads of tobacco
that the said Deft, received the same and ought not to be accountable for
the same to the Compt, Thomas, that the said Deft, cutt down timber by
order of the Compt, Thomas, that they had possession delivered them by
the Compt, Thomas, and have his estate and ought not to be account-
able to the Compt, and deny they detain any provisions or wearing apper-
taining to the Compt, Thomas, and that the Compt, account exhibited before
the Judge, J. Flamantary was sett aside by the Shew of Cotton Taylor and
Cotton Bungee, and deny they possessed themselves of any part of the
personall estate more than what was delivered, and confessed the Compt,
did not bid to the said Deft, with the Compt, and that the said Deft,
refused to allow the same, that the Compt, wanting a woman servant
did employ a man servant, named Boole to work for the said Deft, for
long as the woman servant should stay and work for the said Compt,
and the said woman belonging to the Compt, Thomas the said Compt, left
with the Compt, Thomas his wife, to cure her of a sore leg, to which
answer of the Deft, the said Compt, being much in doubt. The Compt, replied
sp. cally and say, that the Deft, by simple and fraudulent means
caused the Compt, Thomas to sign and seal several papers the
contents of which she never heard read, and utterly deny the said receipts
or receipts ran by Law any way discharge the said Deft, that the Compt,
Thomas and Deft, Edward submitted all differences to the Chancellor
who awarded the Deft, Edward to pay unto the Compt, Thomas four
thousand seven hundred forty six pounds of tobacco, that there was in
thousand pounds of tobacco more due upon the account but by neglect
of the Compt, was omitted out of the account upon the Chancellor
Shew deny the said Deft, paid the said four thousand seven
hundred forty six pounds of tobacco to the Compt, on either of
them, that the Deft, intreated the Compt, Thomas to give discharge
for the same deny how or what can discharge the said bond, that
the Compt, exhibited their Just accounts of Legals estate after
(the
