Then M<sup>r</sup> Carvills objection aforesaid, & insisting upon his want of  
truly notice, the Comp<sup>t</sup>, though he had proved his serviceing the  
Chiditors warrant as aforesaid, did proffer that he shd defend the  
paying the charges of his dayes waiting, It should be adjourned  
to a further day, but then M<sup>r</sup> Carville the defendant Attorney refused,  
Prided the Chiditor to call for the defendant Dousay in and told him  
what they had proffered to his Attorney who replied that wch  
his Counsel did he consulte to, but not further would  
Thereupon the Chiditor proceeded to recite the cause into the said  
Examinate, Then upon the Chiditor calling againe for M<sup>r</sup>  
Dousay to know whether he would acknowledge a Receipt that M<sup>r</sup>  
Bland alledged was his, for certaine bills, Dousay looking upon  
the name to the Receipt acknowledged it was his hand, but upon  
Reading the Receipt it felld her dismayed that ever he had sign'd  
that writing, and by that time his Attorney M<sup>r</sup> Carville was  
followed him into the presence of the Chiditor and therfore forbade him  
to saye or denye any thing, or to answer at all before them,  
Chiditor the Chiditors that he could not owe them payment,  
and therfore advised his Client as he did, least his Client should  
doe himselfe any wrong.

Then the Chiditor proceeded to Examination of the  
Comp<sup>t</sup> attorney, and upon what appeared before them to have been  
proceeds allowed to the said Comp<sup>t</sup> as followeth

M<sup>r</sup> Bland produced an Account wherein he made himselfe £145429
