

Bounds of Tobacco, also the Defendant for w<sup>ch</sup> the Comp<sup>y</sup> by  
agreements was to pay the sum of two hundred pounds of  
Tobacco, Also the Def<sup>t</sup> by the ord<sup>r</sup> and Request of the Comp<sup>y</sup>  
did pay for him to John Baker the sum of Eight hundred  
fifty and Eight pounds of Tobacco w<sup>ch</sup> he ow'd him by bill of  
two hundred and Ten pounds of Tobacco w<sup>ch</sup> he ow'd him by  
accounts and took in his bill and discharge for the whole from  
the said Baker also at his Request did pay unto Mr John  
Griggo in part of two ord<sup>r</sup> of Courts obtained against the Comp<sup>y</sup>  
the sum of two thousand one hundred pounds of Tobacco, and  
also at his request did pay unto Gerrard Banfwarriegen the sum  
of two hundred pounds of Tobacco in part of an ord<sup>r</sup> of Courts  
obtained ag<sup>t</sup> the Comp<sup>y</sup> by the said Banfwarriegen, also the Def<sup>t</sup>  
did at the request of the Comp<sup>y</sup> and for his proper d<sup>ts</sup>  
became bound w<sup>ch</sup> the Comp<sup>y</sup> to Thomas Gordon for the sum of one  
thousand five hundred and thirty pounds of Tobacco in our bill and  
both their hands and is also dated the nineteenth of July 1677  
Said the same and also paid for him by the ord<sup>r</sup> to Nicholas Painter  
the sum of thirty pounds of Tobacco, and also unto William Carke  
for Receiving and Carrying Nine thousand two hundred and  
fourteen pounds of Tobacco for him the said Comp<sup>y</sup> the sum of  
Six hundred pounds of Tobacco, And the said Comp<sup>y</sup> did offer the  
said Def<sup>t</sup> to make over his Land to him for security for what he  
ow'd him, and if the Def<sup>t</sup> would draw the security granted to pay  
him for the same four hundred pounds of Tobacco, so by the said  
Comp<sup>y</sup> and Def<sup>t</sup> coming to an account together the nineteenth day  
of July 1677. The said Comp<sup>y</sup> was indebted to the said Def<sup>t</sup> the sum of  
Just sum or quantity of twenty five thousand Eighty and Eight  
Bounds of Tobacco as by accounts to the answer annexed might appear  
and accordingly the said Comp<sup>y</sup> by the said Def<sup>t</sup> then paid in Consideration  
thereof and the Receipts whereof hee therin by acknowledged. Did  
Grant bargain sell demise Lett and to farme Lett to the Def<sup>t</sup> all  
the four parcels of Land mentioned in the said Def<sup>t</sup> of Reference  
into One Intire Tract of Land and Called by the name of Wellington  
Lying in Salway County aforesaid, then Reference for Eleven  
hundred and Seventeen Acres, and then in the Occupation of the  
said Comp<sup>y</sup> or his Assignes, w<sup>ch</sup> all houses orchards Gard<sup>ns</sup>
