

thereof from the said Compt^{ts} to the d^ofl. and his heirs for ever
 for the said sum of Eighteen thousand pounds of Tobacco, w^{ch} hee
 tendered to the said Compt^{ts} to take & d^ofl. to make up accounts
 w^{ch} him for the Remaind^r but the Compt^{ts} absolutely refused to take
 the same or to come to any account, whereupon the d^ofl. was compelled
 (for the Recovery of his just rights) to sue out the said two Writs
 and Com^{ts} the said Decree of Exchequer in the said Case mentioned
 of w^{ch} the said Compt^{ts} having Notice did d^ofl. the said Decree to
 forbear any further Proceeding upon the same assuring him that
 hee would come to a just and fair Account & would on Demand
 execute the Decree aforesaid, and that hee would put the d^ofl. into
 the quiet and peaceable possession of the said Land called
 Clayhamond and Courtownd, only d^ofl. that there might be a
 Clause of Resumption thereof in the said Decree that if hee paid back
 the said Eighteen thousand pounds of Tobacco and Ten thousand
 pounds of Tobacco more for the Charge the d^ofl. should be sett in
 Building & clearing upon the same hee might Reposs^{ess} and
 enjoy the same, and upon Payment of what should afterwards
 appear to be due hee might have all the said Decree void up and
 cancelled, And thereupon the Compt^{ts} by the Decree bearing date the
 first day of Sep^r in the year of our Lord 1670 in Confidence of
 the said sum of Eighteen thousand pounds of Tobacco the Receipt
 whereof hee then by Acknowledg^{mt} did give Grant alien bargain
 sell Con^{firm} & Confirmation to the said d^ofl. his heirs & assigns for
 ever the said Tract of Land called Clayhamond containing three
 hundred and fifty acres more or less lying on the East side of
 Augustus River above Hunting Creek in the woods and all the other
 piece of Land called Courtownd therunto adjoining containing
 two hundred and fifty acres more or less being parts of the
 Eleven hundred and sixteen acres there, w^{ch} all and every their
 appurtenances & all debts and Writings concerning the same, w^{ch}
 the Compt^{ts} that if the Compt^{ts} his heirs & assigns should pay and satisfy to the d^ofl. his heirs or assigns
 or any of them in some convenient place in Hunting Cr^{ick} the
 half a Mill of some convenient Landing place there the fees and just
 sum of Twenty Eight thousand pounds of good sound and current
 Money
