

Place aforesaid. Where before them aforesaid the said Joseph Hill  
 and Christopher Rousby Esq. and Thomas Bland quill his  
 Attorney. as also the said George Barkard. Esq. and Robt. Carvill  
 & Robert Ridgely his Attorney. and then and there a Copy of  
 the Comptrolers bill being produced before them they did receive the  
 D-fts answer thereto her being the same duly sworn as  
 aforesaid. And upon Reading of the said Comptrolers bill and D-fts  
 Answer the same appeared to be as before is set forth & Referred  
 Whereupon and upon Reading the said bill Answer & accounts  
 to the said Answer amended. Every Article whereof was  
 particularly Read to the said Comptrolers and his Attorney, & hearing  
 what they had to object against the said accounts, and upon due  
 Examination of such Writings as were produced before them aforesaid  
 on the part of the Comptrolers and of the said D-fts upon such Interrogatories  
 as were produced before them and were in the said bill Answer to the  
 said Reports and Award Dooms and Judgments of the said  
 Comptrolers amended, and having seriously and Deliberately Considered  
 of all and singular the matters and things to them by the word  
 aforesaid Referred, and of the said Demand for Ten thousand  
 pounds of Tobacco by him all-adged to be laid out & Expended in  
 Stables building and fencing upon the said Land called Payhamond  
 & of the Damages sustained for want of the Tobacco Expended laid  
 out, but and Disburged as aforesaid, and of the Charge of the  
 said Referred and of the Costs of the first aforesaid as of the  
 profits received by the said D-fts of the Land aforesaid, And  
 hearing what could be all-adged on both sides. They were all  
 clearly satisfied that the said Accounts Exhibited by the said D-fts  
 and to the said Answer amended amounting to the said sum of  
 thirty thousand five hundred & seven pound of Tobacco was a  
 fair Just and true account, save only that they thought fit to  
 abate and deduct out of the said sum of Twenty thousand seven  
 hundred & seven pound of Tobacco. so that upon a Just and true account the  
 said Comptrolers stood truly indebted to the said D-fts for his Cruisers  
 D-fts without Damages or Costs the sum of twenty nine thousand  
 four hundred & eighty and one pound of Tobacco, for Security of
