

Ordered and Directed as aforesaid or any part ther. of Nor hath been
 paid the same or any part thereof Nor would the said Comp. be
 bound the said Law of Attorney for the Delivery of possession of
 the premises to the said D. J. according to the said Decree as by the
 Officers of the said James Cranford and George Curwin may more at
 Large appear But the said Comp. is since a prisoner for Nonpayment
 of the same for to and is in contempt for breach of the said Decree
 as aforesaid. And forasmuch as the dwelling house where the said Comp. lastly
 lived being the Law in Question Morgaged and Leased as aforesaid Doth
 very much run to ruin and decay in so much that if the said house
 be not taken to repair the same it will fall Down, and that several
 of the fruits trees in the Orchard and planted and destroyed by cattle and
 other things for want of a fence to the said Orchard, and that all
 the Tobacco houses and outhouses together with all the houses belonging
 to the plantation at Hunting Creek are fallen down and run to ruin
 and decay And that all the low and halve and hoggs of the said Comp.
 run wild in the wood and are lost and destroyed for want of looking
 after to the great Damage of him or them to whom the said
 plantation doth belong as by a certificate and the hands of several
 of the neighbours now produced doth appear It was
 therefore prayed that a Commission may issue to the Sheriff of Calvert County
 forthwith to put and keep the said George Parker in the quiet and
 peaceable possession of the said plantation houses lands with the
 appurtenances of him the said Joseph Tully at Hunting Creek aforesaid
 Morgaged and Leased to the said D. J. And that the said George Parker
 his heirs Executors and Assigns may lawfully and peaceably hold and enjoy
 the said Morgaged or Leased premises or so much thereof as is not before
 Ordered and Directed against the said Joseph Tully and his heirs or
 Assigns to be also discharged and barred of all Equity of Redemption
 according to the said Decree W. the Court held reasonable and doth
 Order the same accordingly
