

The same should extend to the discharge of any other matter or thing what soever then the matters in Controversy then between the said Comp^{ts} & Taylor upon the said suite in law with the said Taylor avowed it should not & that he had paid the 7000 Tobacco affd to the J^d Walker But the J^d Taylor having so cunningly and craftily obtained the J^d Release refused paym^t of the said 7000th tobacco to the said Day although he had made it his own proper Debt by passing his Note under his hand to Walker for the same & the said Walker according to his promise ought to have delivered in the J^d bill to the J^{ts} yet the said Defendant considering together the J^d Day having given the J^d Note past by Taylor for the J^d account to Walker ag^t w^{ch} the J^d Release could not operate being made his prop^r Debt as affd concealed the same to give color to an action ag^t the J^{ts} upon his said Bill past to the J^d Walker for the said 7000th tobacco as affd the said Day did put the J^d Bill in suite ag^t the J^{ts} although in truth the same was paid by Taylor's Note passed as affd wth the J^d Taylor ought to have paid as affd the Release affd not withstanding there fore to discover the said Note passed by Taylor to Walker & if Walker did not accept the same in satisfaction of the debt due to him from the J^{ts} & if thereby the J^d Taylor did not make it his proper debt & the J^d Walker did not promise upon receipt thereof to deliver in the J^{ts} said Bill for the J^d 7000th tobacco & whether the J^d Release was ever intended to release the said debt of 7000th tobacco or only the suite commenced touching the debt of Quigly & to be released ag^t the J^d action at law & the Release aforesaid is the effect of the said Comp^{ts} Bill To which the said Edward Day by answer sayed he demurred combination wth the other Defendant & that he knew nothing of the Transactions between the J^d Comp^{ts} & Taylor & Walker concerning the supposed 7000th tobacco in the Bill mentioning But sayed that he having married the J^d Walkers Ex^{or} & having possessed himself of his writings found among them a Note subscribed with the Name of Thomas Taylor wherein he obliged himself to be accountable to the said Thomas Walker for the use of the said Complainant for the sume of 6207th of tobacco & did verily believe the said note to be subscribed wth the proper hand writing of the J^d Thomas Taylor which said sume of 6207th of tobacco was demanded of the J^d Thomas Taylor the 17th day of January 1683: but the said Taylor utterly denied payment thereof saying he had a Genall Release from the J^{ts} & therefore would not pay the same wth said note followeth in these words, Cap^t Thomas Walker to be 1679- It shall oblige mee to be accountable to you upon the account of me Hanswringen 6000th of tobacco from your Loving friend Thomas Taylor likewise 207th of tobacco more from Thomas Taylor But how the said Walker came by the said Note or whether the
