 thirty paces where y^e first bounded Oak of y^e said two thousand
 five hundred acres of Land did stand to y^e best of my Memory
 & Knowledge I being herunto confirmed by y^e Memory I hold
 now retain of y^e Asshen Swamp & y^e herunto adjacent
 grounds which y^e Asshen Swamp is by y^e River side & thir
 Swamp above a great high point by y^e River side on y^e pr
 thousand five hundred acres of Land & commonly known & called
