WHEREAS heretofore that is to say the 26th Day of May 1694 Jm. Tamm
 of Salvert County planter Exhibited his Bill of Compt into the Hon^{ble} Co. of
 agt Jm. Sollars Gent. & Nich^l Fountain planter debts there by setting
 forth that said late Lord Prop. by his patent under his great Seal the
 the 20th Day of Octob^r 1688 did grant to one W^m Lowry of said County
 planter a piece of Land called Lowrys Chaud lying in fishing Creek
 next the Land of Francis Swinford on the west in the Land of
 Arthur Thompson on the North beginning at a p^o Thompson
 white oak bound tree w^{ch} a line by the p^o Thompson Land South
 west for the length of 150 pches to a bound white oak in the North
 line of the Land of Richard Smith and a p^o Smiths line North for
 the length of 32 pches to a bound white oak on the North the same
 w^{ch} a line drawn North west for a length of 150 pches to a mark
 white oak in the South line of the said Swinford Land on the East the same
 w^{ch} the said Land South for the length of 320 pches to a first bound
 tree containing a Land out for 300 Acres more or less thus the said
 being there by the Compt of the said Land did the 20th of March 1682 for
 the Confidacion of 9000^l of tobacco pd by the Compt bargained & sell the
 said Land to the Compt by their assign for ever w^{ch} a general war-
 rant usual covenants in the Deed made there of as by the said
 may more at large appear at the said time the said W^m Lowry
 gave the Compt a Bond of 18000^l tobacco personally for performance of
 the covenants in the said Deed that the said W^m Lowry by the Compt
 of the promise & by the said Sollars having a desire to purchase a part
 of the Compt because it lay contiguous to other Lands of the said Sollars
 Compt agreed to sell the same to him accordingly having shewed
 the said Sollars his title by the said Deed from Lowry according to the said
 the said Sollars ordered the like conveyance to be drawn for the Compt
 to be sold to Sollars as Lowry had done to the Compt w^{ch} the covenants
 & Gen^l warranty as aforesaid by the Compt for a Confidacion of 11000^l of
 tobacco to him pd by Sollars did make & execute accordingly and the
 Sollars did then request of the Compt a bond of 22000^l of tobacco
 & form of covenants in the said Deed to the Compt as aforesaid and
 sealed knowing that the said W^m Lowry had not done any act
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
