

Deposition of Wm Gary for Jacob Gibson

By virtue of a Commission from y<sup>e</sup> Court of Chancery to y<sup>e</sup> Director dated y<sup>e</sup> first day of this Instant Sept<sup>r</sup> 1750 y<sup>e</sup> subscribers do testify that having called before us y<sup>e</sup> within named William Gary (aged about fifty nine years) We have examined y<sup>e</sup> Will upon oath and y<sup>e</sup> Deponent saith

That about thirty years ago or more living in St Michaels River & in a flock of y<sup>e</sup> River called Lees Creek had a knowledge of a certain tract of Land called Champaignham then in y<sup>e</sup> possession of one Abraham Bishop & about twenty or 30 years ago saw y<sup>e</sup> Land run out. & two or three times since by y<sup>e</sup> then County Surveyors who always began at a bounded point by y<sup>e</sup> then County Surveyors who always began at a bounded point being always bounded y<sup>e</sup> first bounded line of a parcel of Land called Bondon & from thence running down Lees Creek to a point of Marsh being y<sup>e</sup> outermost point of Lees Creek making into St Michaels River about which run in a small Cove called Bishop's Cove at which point was formerly many Codges growing and y<sup>e</sup> old y<sup>e</sup> Wm with some others of the oldest planters has looked several times for a bounded Cove but never could find any at y<sup>e</sup> point nor between y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid Cove being y<sup>e</sup> first bounded line of y<sup>e</sup> aforesaid tract & y<sup>e</sup> point. Witness our hands & seals y<sup>e</sup> 2 day of Sept<sup>r</sup> in y<sup>e</sup> year of our Lord 1758

Maryland's Deposition of Wolf Hunt

The Deposition of Wolf Hunt of Annaparandell County Chirurgion aged forty four yeares or thereabouts saith that he this Deponent in y<sup>e</sup> year 1681 being then a servant to Coll Phillimon Loyd was Present & Carried y<sup>e</sup> chains at executing a Warrant of Resurvey for uniting of severall tracts of Land belonging unto y<sup>e</sup> Loyd lying & being in y<sup>e</sup> River on an Island called Loyds Insula does well remember y<sup>e</sup> Coll Loyd att y<sup>e</sup> end of y<sup>e</sup> second line of y<sup>e</sup> Land then surveyed & run into y<sup>e</sup> Plantation Capt. Hemsly then lived on he sent for y<sup>e</sup> Hemsly & desired him to bring his own Circumferenter with him so he did & therewith set of y<sup>e</sup> Course they run as well as y<sup>e</sup> Surveyor that then surveyed y<sup>e</sup> same to prevent any error which he did & agreed with y<sup>e</sup> Course & this Deponent doth likewise remember y<sup>e</sup> in running y<sup>e</sup> line it run y<sup>e</sup> Plantation y<sup>e</sup> Capt. Hemsly complained y<sup>e</sup> that line would prejudice him & thereupon Coll Loyd replied y<sup>e</sup> y<sup>e</sup> Course would not carry them otherwise they not having run into any Patent or Land that belonged to y<sup>e</sup>
