 wth them and told him as he was then Even wth him he would
 now be odd againe, or words to that same purpose: and m^r.
 Parrott returned him Another: Aorty Curse and told him he
 did not Care whether he was or no: and as to Cakes: m^r.
 Parrott never paid my father a farthing more than three
 pounds some odd money: for Daniell Longman his wife and
 child and for Sab^l: he never paid my father any but in year
 1684 - or 1685 or 1686 he paid two bills for the J^d Longman he
 never paid any sume and as for any other money the J^d Parrott
 shall or may make the Estate of Daniell Longman J^d wth paid to
 my father for the use of the J^d Longman, It itt Enormous
 for there never was a farthing more of m^r. Parrott by my fa-
 ther for Longmans use but the above J^d money for Cakes
