Thompson to give his Evidence to be
Possessor of a tract of Land called Admiration
Now belonging to Mr: Nathl: Rogers but first taken up by the said
Capt: George Thompson who being brought there an Evidence of 23rd Day
of June 1702 my self with several others was present at a bounded White
Oak that standeth near an after Swamp in an Indian field w^{ch} Swamp is
fourth Swamp above a high point of Land in the said Rogers Land now
known and called by the name of the following Point where Col: Addison
demanded of Capt: Thompson whether he thought that to be the first
bounded Tree and Beginning of the aforesaid Land who after knowing his Oath
duly administered by the Commissioners appointed did lay his hand on the
bounded White Oak above expressed; and did there declare upon Oath
that he did really in his Conscience believe that to be the very Tree, and
being also asked by Col: Addison whether they Crossed any Swamp in Running
