Aged forty nine years or thereabouts being sworn before us upon the Holy Evangelist
saith that Col^o J^o: Addison having obtained a Commission from the high Court of
Chancery bearing date the Eleventh Day of May 1695 Directed to M^r: Witt^m
Hutchison and my self to examine Capt: George Thompson of St: Mary's County
and take his Evidence touching the Bounds of M^r: Notly Rogers Land called
Admirathorea the beginning bounded Tree thereof being also the beginning
of Col^o J^o: Addison's Land called St: Elizabeth in Obedience to w^{ch} Commission
we caused ^{the said} Capt: George Thompson to come before us upon y^e said Land the 27th Day
of May 1696. When we went by Water with the said Thompson from Broad
Creek up the River to Search for the first bounded Tree of the said two Tracts
of Land, he being desirous to go by Water because they went by Water when
they first took up the Land called Admirathorea, and as we was Rowing up
Potomack River by the said Land Capt: Thompson caused us to put a Stone by the
North Side of an Ashen Swamp w^{ch} Swamp is the Fourth Swamp above a
high point of Land now known to us by the Name of the hollowing Point
and there by the Side of the said Swamp in an Indian field we found a
bounded white Oak w^{ch} Tree Capt: George Thompson did declare upon Oath before
us he did really believe to be the first bounded Tree of the said two Tracts of Land
above Expressed, and did positively declare and affirm that if that was not ^{very} the Tree he
was confident it did stand within twenty or twenty five paces of that bounded White
Oak and if any way nearer y^e River all w^{ch} he solemnly declared upon Oath and further
your Depoⁿant saith not.

Aged twenty two years or thereabouts being sworn before us upon the Holy Evan-
gelist saith that Col^o J^o: Addison having obtained a Commission out of the high Court of
Chancery to Sumons Capt: George Thompson to give his Evidence to the Bounds of a
Tract of Land called Admirathorea now belonging to M^r: Notly Rogers but first taken
by the said Capt: George Thompson who being brought there on Evidence 23rd Day of
June 1702 my self with several others was present at a bounded white Oak that standeth
now in an Ashen Swamp in an Indian field w^{ch} Swamp is the Fourth Swamp
above a high point of Land now known and called by the Name of hollowing
Point
