The Deposition of Robt. Middleton

Aged 53 years or thereabouts sworn saith, that about sixteen
 years ago, ~~Go~~ ^{the} Depoant being along with M^r. Giles Blizard and M^r
 Jm: Wheeler upon a Tract of Land called Blue Plain, the ~~the~~ ^{the} Wheeler
 being to show Blizard the beginning tree of the ~~the~~ ^{the} Land, he brought
 him upon a cove about a quarter of a mile from the side of the
 Creek called Oxon or St. Johns Creek, and told him that M^r. Levyar showed
