


I John Nunam of Pallbot County Planter aged above fifty years, being
 sworn before Civi: Jt: Thomas Smithson, do declare upon my Oath that I did
 mark in Hickory Tree for the first marked Tree of one thousand Acres of
 Land called the four Square, (of w^{ch} four Square, part is now in the Occupation
 of Robert Goudsbrough of Pallbot County Gent.) in presence of William A
 Helmsley the then Surveyor who surveyed the sd Land, and by the special
 order and direction of the sd Surveyor. And that an Old fallen Hickory Tree
 which this seventeenth day of August Anno Dni 1702 I showed to the Civi:
 Jt: Thomas Smithson and near to w^{ch} Hickory he marked an Oak with
 four Notches one right over another in the very same Hickory. In Witness
 whereof I have hereunto put my hand & Seal this Day of August

 said Witnesses upon their Corporall Oath to be by me administered touching
