Interrogatories to be answered to several Evidences in a cause depending
 between J. John Rogers Barronet Plaintiff and John Dargoy Esq. Defendant
 on behalf of the Plaintiff Rogers

1. Do you know the Plaintiff & Defendant?

2. Do you know the Ship Rogers & what time she arrived in this Province?

3. Whether after her arrivall she was by a Court of Vice Admiralty
 at Annapolis in Ann Arundell County to wit the 13th day of November 1702 con-
 demned to be forfeited with all her Gunns Sackts Apparell & Furniture and the
 part thereof to the Queens Maty one third part thereof to the then Gov. of this
 Province and the other third part thereof to John Dargoy the Defendant being
 the Collector of her Matys Customs for the District of Colomock.

4. Do you know have you heard or been informed what the said Ship after Con-
 demnation was appraised to with her Sackts &c.

5. Whether J. John Rogers the Plaintiff of Plymouth in the Kingdom
 of England Merchant was not Sole Owner of the said Ship Rogers and a
 certain Abraham Coler Master before the said Condemnation?

6. Whether after the Condemnation of to wit the 20th of November
 1702 or thereabouts the said John Dargoy the Defendant being then Collector of
 her Matys Customs for Colomock District did by Order of the Court of
 Admiralty or by any other Order undertake the Sale and Disposal of the said Ship
 with all her Gunns Sackts Apparell & Furniture?
