

47. Governour of this province and the other third part thereof to John
Dausy Collector of her Matys Customs of Solomock District.

To 4th That the said ship was appraised to three hundred thirty seven
pounds Shillings & four pence with all her Gunns &c.

To 5th That J^r John Rogers Barronett of Plymouthe in the Kingdom of
England Merchant was sole owner of the said ship and a certain Abraham Peters
Ma^r before the said Condemnation.

To 6th That the said John Dausy the Defend^t did by order of the Court of
Admiralty (to w^{ch}) the 20th of November or thereabouts undertake the
Sale and disposal of the said ship Rogers together with her Gunns Sackes &c.

To 7th That Stephen Harvey then the factor and Agent of the said J^r John
Rogers did purchase the said ship with her Gunns Sackes Apparell and
Furniture for the sum of One hundred ninety seven pounds, Nineteen
Shillings & Eleven pence for the said J^r John Rogers.

To 8th That there were Bills of Exche^r drawn for the aforesaid sum by the said
Harvey but as to their being separate and distinct and to whom paye the
Defendant knowe not.

To 9th That the said Bills of Exche^r were delivered to the said John Dausy in full
Satisfaction for the said ship on behalf of the said J^r John Rogers.

To 10th That the said John Dausy did accept & negotiate the said Bills of Exchange.

To 11th That the said J^r John Rogers did write a Letter to the Defendant that the said
Bills were by him paid to w^{ch} Letter here follows the tenor.

To 12th That the said Dausy did permit the said Peter as Ma^r of the said ship Rogers
to load the same upon his receiving the said Bills of Exche^r as he the said
Dausy being then Collector of her Matys Customs for Solomock District.

To 13th That the said Peter did load the said ship with three hundred and
thirty seven hogheads of Tobacco by vertue of the Authority & permission
he had from the said Dausy Collector as aft and Coll^r Richard Lee Collector
in Virginia.

To 14th That the said Peter did repair to the house of the said John Dausy
the 14th of July 1703 and the 20th instant following at his Office as Ma^r
of the said ship Rogers to clear the same in order to joine the Convoy then
ready to sail (viz^t) the Halmouth & York two of her Majestys Ships
of War.

To 15th That the said Ships of War were then in Virginia and ordered to
Convoy to England all such Ships as were then in Virginia & Maryland
and ready to sail.

To 16th That the said Dausy upon Application made to him by the said Peter
to clear the said ship did promise to clear the same provided the said Peter
would meet him at his Office then kept at Tower Hill near Lindy Bridge
