That as this Dept being spent when y Capt James Murphy and Mr
Hugh Barwood did examine Geo Mason and Jo Hollinworth as Eviden
ces to prove the bounded tree of a Tract of Land called Wades point
the y Evidence (being sworn by y Capt James Murphy) upon their Oaths
did say y they had formerly seen a bounded Oak tree standing upon
a point at y Mouth of a Cove which tree was reputed and deemed
to be the first bounded tree of y Land called Wades point, which
y Cove this Dept saith is y Cove at y head of which Union
Williams plantation is now situated; And further saith y the y
Jo Hollinworth did say he had lived some time on y other side of y Cove
directly opposite to y bounded tree and that he thought he could
have shot a bullet from his dwelling house into y tree; And
further this Dept saith y Geo Mason saith y (at several
times whilst he was a servant to Capt Wm Lewis who owned y Land)
he had jumped into and under or about y tree: And as to y
second bounded tree this Dept saith that being once summoned upon
a jury of a survey of y Land called Wades point, he did see a point
tree at y Mouth of a Swampy Gully on y Bay side which by some
marks upon it did appear to be a bounded tree and was at that time
reputed to be y second bounded tree of y Land called Wades point
and y first bounded tree of a Tract of Land called Haddon and
further saith not. arr.
