

575. said, reputed to be the second bounded piece of Wades point, & the first of a Tract of Land called Haddon, close by the north side of which Gully almost in a line and about 30 paces distant from the place where the former bounded Tree stood (according to the Evidence) now stands a bounded piece which some of the Evidence upon their Oaths do say was bounded by the order of Capt James Murphy & Mr Hugh Sturwood at the Examination of the former Evidence. No further Certificate it appears by in the Depositions taken by Capt James Murphy and Mr Hugh Sturwood this Tract of Land being called Wades point in stead of Wades point must be a mistake in them, for it appears by the Evidence now Examined to be the same Land and by patent called Wades point, Given under our hands and Seals at St Michaels River this 10th day of May in the 5th year of our Majesties Reign Annoq. Domini 1707.
