

4<sup>th</sup> I heard the Skipper say that her Sails was bad and doe know that Mr Forbes did borrow a Cropping Iron of Mr Knowles  
5<sup>th</sup> G Said nothing

6<sup>th</sup> About Seavenenteen or Eighteene dayes after I delivered the boat to Mr Forbes soming to my quarters there red notice of Mr Forbes Comming by Ralph Stevens that he had sent his ffe man boat to Wye bound and had no further use for her by reason she was insuffitient to doe his business through her leabiness and desired me to informe Mr Lowe in about four dayes I witt to Mr Lowe to acquaint him of the matter: Under stood by Ralph Stevens that the Boat <sup>had</sup> beeke alredy bound about a weeke: and that he had beeke at my quarters three or four dayes to tell me of it I asked Ralph Stevens why they had not carried her to Mr Lowe at Chichester according to Agreement who replid she was soe leaby that they were affraid to venture their lives in her

7<sup>th</sup> I witt to Mr Lowe to acquaint him of the boates being at Wye but whether he red my letter or had notice by other meane I know not

8<sup>th</sup> I did employ Edward Ryssell to keepe the water out of her and gave him about ffe Shillings and apaid of shoose for a daies whiche told he went two or thre times a day to pump her out she would haue sunke

9<sup>th</sup> Vithill

10<sup>th</sup> When I delivred the boat to Mr Forbes I had directions to engage him to send her to Mr Lowe at Chichester and when I asked Mr Forbes whether he would carry her ther he replid yes for he had goods at Chichester and shoope should take the boat for a longer tymd of Mr Lowe: as to the discouer about the pricd of the hire doe remembere

11<sup>th</sup> I doe know by information of the Skipper that before and at the time Mr Forbes hired the ffe man boat that she was very leaby and that after she came to Wye and not looked after she sunke
