

Unterstained and insufficienſed of the Defendants answer to him his
 Complaint now and at all times hereafter saved and reserved. He had
 Comptie in and by this his Registration rights and Showells in every matter
 and thing, and in and by his said Bill of Complaint he had formerly said
 showed: And that he would maintaine his said Bill of Complaint and the
 matters contained therin to be true in unto such manner and forme
 as they were therein by him self forth and expressed. And thereupon
 for the better Strengthening and fortifying the Comptie's said Bill of
 Complaint: and what was herein self forth — Anably prayd Court
 might issue to some honest and discrete person to examine upon
 Oaths (with Evidence as shalbe appointed to him) to all such matters
 as shalbe interrogated: relating to unto things as are self forth
 in the said Bill: And that unto Court may be returned of the Depositions
 as shall be taken before them into this hand the Court by all convenient
 speed: whiche being granted Court issued to Mr R: Highmore of Talbot
 County herbaul purposed; whiche the said Highmore attested of: and
 soone after made returned thereth together with the Depositions of
 Colle Edward Lloyd & M^r W^m Cunsey taken and sworn to before said Mr
 Highmore whiche follows in these words (Viz.)

Mr William Cunsey's Deposition — I doe know Colle Comptie and his
 Sonne syne in March Court, I believe the One and Twentie day of March
 in the year 1699 being in Company with Colle Edw Lloyd and M^r John Howells
 and others at the house of Mr Jane Remsley: Mr Alexander Forber came
 and desired me and the rest of the Company to stay there some small time
 until Robert Smith Esq^r came: And to bear witness for him; and the
 said Forber: that he did tender to the said Smith a deed or Deed of Convey
 for the several parts of land: whiche he said he had purchased of the said
 Smith for him to signe Seale and acknowledge according as by aforesaid
 bond or Obligation he was obliged whiche Obligation both then and before
 he showed me: And accordingly the said Smith came and in the porch of
 the said house the said Forber did tender to him certaine Deed or
 Writing drawn by way of Lease and Release of the said Land to Seale
 And deliver whiche he utterly refused to doe: Whereupon the said Forber
 and others in Company desired the said Smith that he would bear the
 Deeds read or read them himselfe that he might the better Judge
 whether they were such as he was obliged to signe or not but he
