of the Council on Both sides thoroughly heard and the substance thereof
duly taken into Consideration and happening upon the whole matter
that the Comp^{ty} James had for a good ^{and} valuable Consideration purchased
the Land in his Bill of Comp^{ty} mentioned ^{or other other persons}
under defect and defect and y^t the Inheritance remained in ^{the} said
Calvert in the Bill mentioned or some other person deriving under him
and that whatever Fraud might be shewd the said Rich^d Calvert &
