


Maryland Cal: Countyss. Jan 7<sup>th</sup> 1710

The test of Peter Sawell of the above County being  
 a Quaker, Aged thirty nine years or thereabouts who  
 Declares before God and the world that about Twenty nine  
 years since (to his best remembrance) his brother John  
 Sawell had a Warrant of Prosewy upon the Land called  
 Cedar Branch (Commonly called Chaplains Land) and  
 James Beale the Surveyor being Runing a Line from the  
 River Side into the woods, and having Run the precise  
 Number of perches, it fell short of the place where the  
 Standards said the bound tree of the above said Land stood  
 therefore they went to the Orchard of one William Prichard  
 where the above said Peter Sawell see the Stumps of a Tree Stand-  
 -ing between a Redbudd tree and a Mulberry (Now Standing) which  
 the Generality of the persons then present, Viz: Michael  
 Tansy Senr. Edward Pack Senr. Thomas Sedgwick Senr. &  
 Edward Cowdery did say <sup>was</sup> one of the bound trees of the above  
 Land and further he saith not. — Peter Sawell
