By Virtue of her Majesty's Writ of Reguod Lignum out of her Majesty's
high Court of Chancery bearing Date the Twentieth day of October last past
to me directed Commanding me to Summon Thomas Good and his full name of my
Baywick to make Diligent Inquiry of the Damages of Twenty Acres of
Land at the head of Morgans Creek in said County viz Ten Acres of Land
On the one Side of the said Run and Ten Acres of the other Side the said
Run of Water for the building of a Mill at the head of said Creek for Thomas
Officer of said County by him assigned to Daniel Jenkins of said
County

These are therefore to Certify that in obedience to the said Writ I have
Summoned and called and Thomas Good and his full name of my Baywick
Qualified as the said Writ requireth who upon their oaths beginning at a
marked Red Oak Standing on the West Side of the main Branch commonly
called the head of Morgans Creek and from said Oak running West and by North
forty perches then East and by South to a marked poplar Standing by said Run
and then up the said Run and by with said Run to the first Tree containing
Ten Acres on the West Side Run then beginning at the Run Side on the
East Side said Run opposite to the said Oak on the West Side running
thence East and by South forty perches then South and by West forty perches
then West and by North to the said Run then up the said Run to the first
beginning on the East Side containing Ten Acres on the East Side said Run
The which said Ten Acres of Land on the West Side said Run the which
said Ten Acres of Land on the West Side said Run the Jury Value to give
hundred pounds of Tobacco and on the East Side said Run the Ten Acres to
two hundred pounds of Tobacco; Wee the Jurors not knowing the owners
