Creek near said Whitty's old Landing, and from thence might fifty paces ab-
northwest, to a white oak which they then did mark standing in the Edge of
the high Land (Close by the Marsh Side, the said White oak being now fallen
but the said Denwood showed us the Superiors the place as he believed -
where the white oak or market Tree grows, and further saith not
