 unto the said Company or their order the like quantity of Stock of
 Oath hogs and goods in the said and mentioned according

 the Receipt or other Legall Discharge or Release under the

 that the said Debts do also forthwith Quitt the possession

 peaceably to the said Company and upon payment of the said Sum of two
 hundred and fifty pounds of Tobacco goods and Plantation
