By Virtue of a Commission out of the High Court of Chancery bearing Date at the City of Annapolis the Sixth day of March in the Ninth year of Her Majestys Raigne Anno Domini one thousand Seven hundred & Four Directed to us Robert Skinner John Mackall and Daniel of St. Thomas Justice or any two of us to examine Evidence touching the bounds of a parcel of Land laid out for Wm Chaploun in Calvert County &c

These are therefore to Certifie that Wee John Mackall and Daniel of St. Thomas Justice Commissioners above nominated here called before us Gilbert Deavour and George Lynnes of Calvert County and have taken their Deposition and Produced the Same into writing under their hands which are hereunto annexed this day of ap. Anno Domini 1711

The Deposition of Gilbert Deavour aged forty four years or thereabouts Declares upon the holy Evangelist that about seven years ago one Edward pack who was owner of part of the aforesaid parcel of Land told him the Deposition that the place where the said Deposition now stands was the place that the Stake of Chaplains Land stood which divided the said packs Land and the Land of one Michael Tansy and the said Deposition further Saith that the said pack told the said Deposition his Father Edward pack the wood in the said place it being in a Gutt which is in a March among the said Chaplains Marsh and further the said Deposition Saith that he heard one Thomas Arnolds a very old Standard near the said Land swear on the holy Evangelist
