 his wife &c. of the last and Testament of William Barton Gent. doth hath
 lately Exhibited their Bill of Complaint in our High Court of Chancery before our
 Trusty and wellbelov'd John Seymour Esq. our late Capt. Generall
 and Keeper of the Great Seale of our Province of Maryland against Simon
 Deale whereby he hath set forth that in the Year of our Lord Seventeen
 hundred and one being Judged to your Orator Sarahs late husband William
 Barton deceased in his life time and when Sheriff of Prince Georges County
 in Divers Sums of Tobacco for Imprisonment fees and Tobacco paid & Disburse
 and for the said Simon Deale in the whole upon a true Balance & State of
 Accounts between them amounting to the Sum of ^{Twenty} four thousand Seven hundred
 Twenty and three pounds of Tobacco that thereupon the said Simon Deale
 after Endeavouring partly to satisfy your Orator Sarahs Testator in his life time
 made and drew out sett of Bills of Exchange for Twenty pounds Sterl payable
 to her said Testator William Barton which was returned to said William
 and likewise your Orators further shew that the said Simon about the
 same time Endorsed over to the said William in his life time one Obligation
 perfected by a certain Humphrey Woods of Prince Georges County planter
 conditioned for the payment of thirty pounds Sterl to the said Simon Deale
 on or before the fourth day of October ^{next} And likewise Endorsed over other
 Obligation perfected by the said Humphrey Woods conditioned for the payment of
 thirty pounds Sterl more to the said Simon Deale on or before the fourth day of
 October Anno Domini 1706 to the said William Barton, And likewise an other
 Obligation perfected by William Ophett of the said County for the Sum of
