to prove the severall promises of his said father Edward and the said
William and the truth of all and singular the promises and therefore in this
honble Court most properly & allowable where the said William Bladen
and John Graol may on their Corporall Oaths to be taken on the holy
Evangelists of almighty God true and full Answer make to all herein
contained as if therein and hereby again particularly Interrogated and
particularly that the said William may sett forth and Declare whether he
did not see the said Hoat for the said sum or for what other sum whether he
did not promise ~~the said~~ your Orat^r at first to pay the same to him & afterwards
protested the same & whether he did see whether your Orat^r father heard at that
time otherwise ordered all the purchase money that was then due to be
