 proper Use and disposal as in and by the same deed remaining on Record in
 the said Exors Court proceedings relation being therein to be seen more
 at Large appear but does not believe the same was Executed and Enrolled
 according to Law whereby to pass any Estate from the said Ed Dorsey and
 this Defend. does believe the Coupl. to be honest Law of his Brother Bro.
 Dorsey who dyed without Issue. And further saith that he is not sensible
 of the said Ed Edward Dorsey's necessity for money in the year 1704 but
 knoweth that on or about the year 1704 an Act of Assembly past to cut of
 the Intale or Settlement of the said Houses and Lots and to Enable Ed Edward
 Dorsey to Sell them for the Use of his said Children but knows nothing of the
 Coupl. Couset thereto. Has heard and believes Ed Dorsey conveyed the said
 Houses and Lots to Charles Carroll and William Bladen Esq. and their Heirs
 and took the said Bladen's Bond dated December 11th 1704 Conditioned for
 the Sum of one hundred and fifty pounds Sterling at three several paym^{ts}
 viz. Fifty pounds at the departure of every of the then next three London
 Fleets to the said Ed Dorsey his Ex. Adm^r. or Assigns And this Defend. saith that
 he knows nothing of the Note of forty pounds drawn by Ed Dorsey Mr. Bladen
 on cam he tell for what Consideration nor what promises the said Bladen made to
 pay the same but denying all Combination and Conspiracy with all or any
 person or persons whatsoever saith that he never received any part of the
 said purchase money nor did he ever hear that his wife Margarette Ex.
 of Edward Dorsey received any part or parcel thereof in her widowhood
 or that the said Bladen ever pretended he had paid any to them and this
 Defend. further saith that he hath fully Administred Ed Dorsey's whole
 Estate unless the said Claim from the said Bladen due by bond as afd to the
 said Ed Dorsey Ex. Adm^r. of one hundred and fifty pound which is Inventory
 in Ed Dorsey's Estate be decreed parcel thereof which he hopes this honorable
 Court will see fit to do the said Ed Dorsey having made ample satisfaction to his
 Children for what he had intended them by the said Dood of Trust to his Brother
 Cap. John Dorsey afd by several devises in his the said Ed Dorsey's last will and
 Testament and this Defend. saith that this honorable the Court is for laying the

publick
