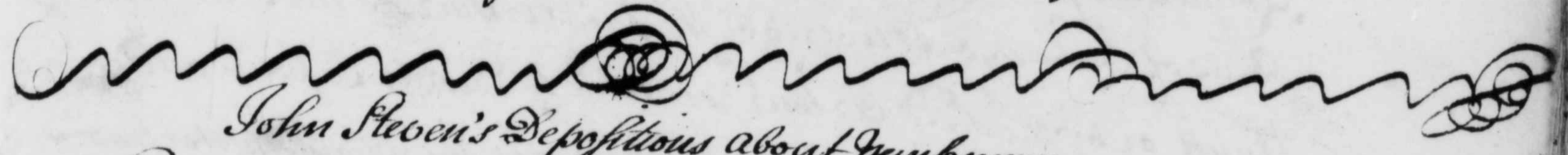

John Steven's Depositions about Nanfomum -

By Virtue of a Commission granted out of the high Court of Chancery
 at the Request of John Stebens directed to us the Subscribers to Examine &
 Evidences touching the bounds of a certain Tract of Land in the said County
 called Nanfomum Woods herewith Certify the Deposition of William Wilboughty
 aged about Eighty Eight years or thereabouts being Examined & sworn on
 the holy Evangelist saith that about thirty seven or thirty eight years ago
 he was at the marking of the first bounded Tree of a parcel of Land called
 Nanfomum which Land which said Land was laid out for John Stebens by
 Henry Parker Deputy Surveyor and this Deposition further saith that
 the first bounded Tree did stand upon a small point between Branches by
 the side of a Creek called Secretarys Creek about a Quarter of a Mile below the
 going over of a branch now called the first Branch where formerly an Indian
 fort stood And further this Deposition saith not as within four lines and
 Seals this 12th day of July Annoq; Dni 1703
