This cause coming upon the seventeenth day of this instant December to be heard upon Bill & Answer (at the humble request of the plaintiff who desired the cause might not be delayed nor his shipp noe longer stayed) in the presence of the Compt^r & Assessors & in the presence of the defendant & his counsell (the defendant Shuford being absent in England) the substance of the Compt^r Bill was, That whereas by a certaine charter party of Assaignement Indented bearing date the twenty seventh day of September One Thousand six hundred Seventy five Between the Compt^r of the one part & the defendant Shuford of the other part the Compt^r did grant & sett to straight the said shipp the Ruth of London then riding at anchor in the River of Thames London unto the said Shuford by the Month for & during the full tyme & space of eight Monthes to begin & be attempted from the Twenty eighth day of September aforesaid & for & during so long tyme & space after the Expiracion of the said eight Monthes not exceeding four Monthes more as it should please the said Merchant his factors or assignes to keepe or employ the said shipp at the rate & price of Sixty five pds Sterling per Month accompting Twenty eight dayes to a Month from the tyme aforesaid And the said Master for himselfe & his factors & assignes did covenant that the said shipp should with the first faire winde & weather after the said Twenty eighth day of September be ready to depart & sett sayle from Gravesend & from thence (the dangers of the seas & casualty excepted) sayle applying tarey & trade to
