

Still perceptible, the above said Cakes is still standing also the two Spanish  
Cakes Saplings which are now small Trees on each Side the Root of the said  
White Cakes, one of which is now dead, and the said white Cakes with the other  
two Trees at his Root now stands about Six foot from the above declared path  
and on the South Side of the same just before the Entrance or mouth of Moales  
Noek (otherwise Woolston Mannor) and is about the Distance of Twenty five  
paces from the head of a great Marsh which proceeds from the head of a  
Creek (by the patent of Giles Land) is called S. James Creek, which Creek  
according to the said Patent is the west and South bound of the said  
Land and falls into the above named Wicocomoco River, and further  
this Depoent saith not.

William Crompton aged fifty and two years or thereabouts  
Declares on the holy Evangelists that about Twenty five years since  
Cap. James Noale did show to this Depoent, a bounded White Cakes Tree  
standing without the narrows of Moales Noek and about Twenty five  
paces from a great Marsh that proceeds according to Giles patent from  
Saint James Creek which falls into Wicocomoco River, and this Depoent  
did then hear the said Cap. James Noale say the said Cakes was the dividing  
Line of Tree of the Land belonging to his Sons James Noale and Anthony Noale  
without the Noek of Woolston Mannor. The said Tree now stands on the South  
Side of a path that Leads from a plantation called Charles Towne Cross a  
Noek of Land and about Six foot from the said path which Cakes Tree  
stands between two small Spanish Cakes (one of which is now dead) and is  
the same White Cakes whereon he now lays his hand, and further saith not.

George Newman aged fifty three years or thereabout doth declare on  
the holy Evangelist that about twenty four years since he did see Cap. Land.  
Brandt then Surveyor of Charles County and Mr. William Roswell then of  
St. Marys County both now dead sworn before Humphry Warren & John  
Curtis (then Justices of the said Charles County) at a bounded white Cakes  
Tree which stands upon Woolston Mannor on the South East or most Side of  
a Creek called Ware Creek and just before the Entrance of a said Creek  
which makes the mouth of the said Creek and declared upon their oaths laying  
(their
