



By virtue of a Commission out of her Majesty's High Court of
Chancery to us directed bearing date the fifth day of September last Impowering
us to call before us such persons as shall be nominated by Mr. James Keech
and to take their severall Depositions of the bounds of a certain Tract of
Land called Trent nook in order therunto we have called before us Mr. John
Boroughs Son and taken his Deposition to the bounds of the said Land
which is as follows.

The Deposition of John Boroughs aged about Sevy Eight years Sworn
upon the holy Evangelist, at some time about seven years agoe there was
a certain Line runn betwixen Mr. Thomas Truman Greenfield and Mr.
James Keech by virtue of a Warrent of Resurvey out of the provinciall
Court, The said Depou. being one of the Chain carriers, saith that there
was a South South East, from the mouth of Trent Creek a long the River
two hundred Eighty five pches to a certain place near the upper end of
a Long Marsh by the said River Tide, and that the said Depou. lived
with Mr. Thomas Truman and had under his care the cattle, Horses,
creatures of the said Trumans to look after in the said nook - which
said nook of Land this Depou. was in it two three or four times a day
for many years, insomuch that this Depou. using the place so
long he is sure he has been at every Tree in the nook now called Trent
(nook)
