 and in the place aforesaid, And further this Deponant saith that the
 third bound Tree of the Land Goodluck was a Hickory which this Depo-
 nant bounded for the third bound Tree of said Goodluck at the time this Depo-
 nant surveyed the Land aforesaid and that the said Hickory stood near to old
 Richard Stalls Dwelling house and further saith that the Hickory which
 stands by the path side that John Law fell Swears, is not the bounded Hickory
 of Goodluck this Depo-^t also saith that that Hickory by the path side
 is not the Hickory that he the said Depo-^t bounded for the third bound Tree
 of the Land called Goodluck: when he the said Depo-^t laid the said Land out
 And further this Depo-^t saith that old Mr. John Leach the father of this
 present John Leach was never in Company with him the said Depo-^t on
 the bounds of the Land called Goodluck either on the original Survey nor
