Whereas heretofore that is to say in May Court in the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred Seventy five Edward Skidmore of the County of Cecil did exhibit his certain bill of Complaint in the High and Just Court of Chancery Against Richard Foxon son & heire of Richard Foxon William Chadborn & Susanna his wife therby setting forth that the Compt Edward Skidmore the last day of June in the one and fortieth year of the Dominion of Cecilius & Anno Domini One thousand six hundred & 10th Seventy one for and in Consideration of eight thousand pounds of tobacco to Richard Foxon of the County of Baltimore within this Province a planter paid & setured to be paid the said Foxon did chsigne sell my and make over to the Compt one hundred Seaventy five Acres of land lying in the said County called Bluntville lying on the East side of Chesapeake Bay next adjoining to the land of William Hills & Southmost bounded wallnut tree running South and by West downe the Bay for breadth Eighty five Perches to a Marked Cedar tree bounded on the South by a line drawn East from the said Cedar for length three hundred twenty Perches. On the East by a line drawn North from the End of the East line for breadth fifty five Perches until it intercesses a parallel drawn from the land of William Hills on the North with the said land & parallel on the West with the said Bay Containing and laid out for one hundred Seaventy five Acres more or less formerly granted unto Richard Blunt of the same County by Patent under the Great Seal of this Province and sold by the said Blunt unto Nathaniell Stiles & by the said Stiles sold unto William Stanley & by the said Stanley sold unto the said Richard Foxon as appears upon Record in the said County of Baltimore Together with all & singular the houses Edifices wayes Easements & Priviledges to the said partall of land belonging or any wayes apperteyning Only the said Foxon to remaine upon the said land untill the first of March one thousand six hundred Seventy two and then to the Compt A sufficient Sale & assurance of the same And the Compt further setting forth that the said Richard Foxon about the month of December one thousand six hundred Seventy one dyed before he had given the Compt any assurance of the said land And made no will leaving behind him Richard Foxon his son an infant of very tender years and Susanna Foxon his wife to whom Administration of all and singular the Goods Chattels & Creditts of the said Richard was by the Chife Judge for Probate of Wills & Granting Administration committed who hath since intermarryed with one William Chadborn And the said Richard Foxon being an infant as aforesaid and the said William Chadborn & Susanna his wife Relict of the said Richard deceased not having Right to Convey the said land to the Complainant And the Compt having no bond under the hand & Seal of the said Richard deceased for conveying the said to the Compt And since his wifes to the said & bargaines may dye before the said Richard Foxon herre may arrive to full age to convey & return the said Land to the Compt And in regard that the Compt hath paid & setured to be paid the whole purchase money of the said land as the Compt is ready to make appear And the said William Chadborn & Susanna his wife Relict of the said Richard do gett keepe possession
