- (2) "RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE PROGRAM" INCLUDES A PROGRAM:
 - (I) LICENSED BY:
 - 1. THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE;
 - 2. THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN RESOURCES; OR
 - 3. THE DEPARTMENT OF JUVENILE SERVICES; AND
- (II) THAT IS SUBJECT TO THE LICENSING REGULATIONS OF THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE FOR CHILDREN MEMBERS OF THE CHILDREN'S CABINET GOVERNING THE OPERATIONS OF RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE PROGRAMS.
- (3) "RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE PROGRAM" DOES NOT INCLUDE ALTERNATIVE LIVING UNITS FOR ADULTS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES SITES LICENSED BY THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES ADMINISTRATION.

(H) "SERVICES" INCLUDES:

- (1) PROVISION OF FOOD, CLOTHING, SHELTER, EDUCATION, SOCIAL SERVICES, HEALTH CARE, MENTAL HEALTH CARE, REHABILITATION SERVICES, AND RECREATION;
 - (2) IN HOME AND COMMUNITY SUPERVISION;
- (3) CASE MANAGEMENT BY A LICENSED SOCIAL WORKER QUALIFIED CASE MANAGER; AND
- (4) OTHER SERVICES PROVIDED BY A RESIDENTIAL CHILD CARE PROCRAM.
- (<u>H</u>) "SINGLE POINT OF ENTRY" MEANS THE INTERACTION BETWEEN THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE FOR CHILDREN OFFICE AND A POTENTIAL PROVIDER THAT OCCURS BEFORE THE PROCESS OF LICENSING WITH AN AGENCY BEGINS.
