

- (3) the State Superintendent of Schools, or a designee;
  - (4) two representatives of the Maryland Association of Boards of Education, appointed by the Association;
  - (5) four public school teachers from different geographic areas of the State, one of whom represents the Maryland State Teachers Association, appointed by the State Superintendent of Schools;
  - (6) two parents of public school students, appointed by the Governor;
  - (7) two public school students, appointed by the Governor;
  - (8) one representative from a nonpublic school, appointed by the Governor;
  - (9) a school psychiatrist or sociologist, appointed by the State Superintendent of Schools;
  - (10) one representative who is knowledgeable in serving students with disabilities, appointed by the Governor;
  - (11) one representative of school bus drivers, appointed by the Governor;
  - ~~(10)~~ (12) the Secretary of State Police, or a designee; and
  - ~~(11)~~ (13) the Attorney General of Maryland, or a designee.
- (c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House jointly shall appoint a chair from the members appointed to the Task Force.
- (d) The Task Force may establish subcommittees as deemed necessary to fulfill its duties.
- (e) The State Department of Education shall provide staff for the Task Force.
- (f) A member of the Task Force:
- (1) may not receive compensation; but
  - (2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.
- (g) The Task Force shall evaluate and make recommendations regarding:
- (1) methods to address the growing incidence of student violence in public schools;
  - (2) methods to provide a safe learning environment for students;
  - (3) the use of video surveillance cameras, metal detectors, and other security devices to improve safety;
  - (4) ensuring the safety of students to and from school during noninstructional hours;
