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- (7) (8) The President of Sojourner-Douglass College, or the President's designee;
- (8) (9) The President of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, or the President's designee;
- (8) (9) (10) One representative from the Blacks of the Chesapeake Foundation;
- (9) (11) One representative from the Reginald F. Lewis Museum of Maryland African American History and Culture; and
 - (10) (11) (12) The following members, appointed by the Governor:
- (i) One representative from Maryland's Tributary Strategy Program;
- (ii) One representative from Maryland's Commission on Environmental Justice and Sustainable Communities;
- (iii) One representative from a local government's zoning and planning team;
- (iv) One representative from the Alliance for the Chesapeake Bay, or a nonprofit organization with a similar mission and role of nonpartisanship;
 - (v) One representative from the African American Land Trust;
- (vi) One representative from the Maryland Land Trusts, or one of Maryland's local land trusts;
- (vii) One representative from the University of Maryland Biotechnology Institute; and
 - (viii) One representative from the Chesapeake Ecology Center.
- (c) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates shall jointly designate the chair of the Task Force.
- (d) The Task Force may establish subcommittees as it determines necessary to fulfill its duties.
- (e) (1) The University System of Maryland and the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Natural Resources, and the Department of the Environment shall provide staff for the Task Force.
- (2) The University System of Maryland and the Task Force shall provide opportunities for internships for students to staff the Task Force in exchange for class credit, to the extent practicable.
- (3) The staff of the Department of Natural Resources <u>and the</u> <u>Department of the Environment</u> shall manage the student intern.
