

(II) A RESIDENTIAL CONDOMINIUM AS DEFINED IN § 11-101 OF THE REAL PROPERTY ARTICLE; OR

(III) A COOPERATIVE HOUSING CORPORATION AS DEFINED IN § 5-6B-01 OF THE CORPORATIONS AND ASSOCIATIONS ARTICLE.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2006.

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## CHAPTER 607

### (House Bill 1201)

AN ACT concerning

#### **Criminal Law - Identity Theft Passports**

FOR the purpose of authorizing a person who knows or reasonably suspects that the person is a victim of identity fraud and has filed a certain report to apply for an identity theft passport; requiring a law enforcement agency that receives an identity theft passport application to submit the application and a copy of a certain report to the Attorney General for certain purposes; authorizing the Attorney General, in cooperation with a law enforcement agency, to issue an identity theft passport to a person who is a victim of identity fraud; prohibiting the Attorney General from issuing an identity theft passport before taking a certain action; authorizing a person to present an identity theft passport to a law enforcement agency or creditor for certain purposes; providing that a law enforcement agency or creditor has sole discretion in accepting or rejecting an identity theft passport; providing that an application for an identity theft passport, including any supporting documentation, is not a public record and may not be released except under certain circumstances; requiring the Attorney General to adopt certain regulations; defining certain terms; making this Act subject to a certain contingency; and generally relating to identity theft passports.
