S.B. 346 VETOES

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That implementation of the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program to be established under § 21-2A-02 of the Health - General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, is contingent on the Advisory Board on Prescription Drug Monitoring established under § 21-2A-03 of the Health - General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, obtaining some federal grant-money in accordance with regulations adopted under § 21-2A-02(d) of the Health - General Article federal, private, or State funds to carry out the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program to be established under § 21–2A–02 of the Health – General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, may not collect prescription monitoring data before June 1, 2007.

SECTION 2. <u>2. 4.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2006.
