- [(g)] (H) (1) The Board shall place a licensee on inactive status, if the licensee submits to the Board:
- (i) An application for inactive status on the form required by the Board; and
  - (ii) The inactive status fee set by the Board.
- (2) The Board shall reactivate the license of an individual who is on inactive status, if the individual:
- (i) Complies with any continuing education requirement established by the Board for this purpose;
  - (ii) Pays to the Board a reactivation fee set by the Board; and
  - (iii) Is otherwise entitled to be licensed.
- (3) If the individual has been on inactive status for 5 years or more, before the Board may reactivate the license, the individual must pass an examination approved by the Board.
- [(h)] (I) The Board, in accordance with its rules and regulations, shall reinstate the license of an individual who has failed to renew the license for any reason if the individual:
  - (1) Is otherwise entitled to be licensed;
- (2) Complies with any continuing education requirement established by the Board for this purpose;
  - (3) Pays to the Board a reinstatement fee set by the Board; and
- (4) Applies to the Board for reinstatement of the license within 5 years after the license expires.
- [(i)] (J) (1) The Board may not reinstate the license of an electrologist or an electrology instructor who fails to apply for reinstatement of the license within 5 years after the license expires.
- (2) The electrologist or electrology instructor may become licensed by meeting the current requirements for obtaining a new license under this subtitle.

- (d) For purposes of this section, an electrologist rehabilitation committee evaluates and provides assistance to an electrologist OR AN ELECTROLOGY APPLICANT in need of treatment and rehabilitation for alcoholism, drug abuse, chemical dependency, or other physical, emotional, or mental condition.

## 8-6B-18.

(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 8-317 of this title and § 8-6B-19 of this subtitle, the Board may deny a license to an applicant, grant a probationary
