SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2. (j) (1) "Tobacco product manufacturer" means an entity that, after the date of enactment of this Act, directly [and] (AND not exclusively through any [affiliate] AFFILIATE):

(i) manufacturers cigarettes anywhere that [the] SUCH manufacturer intends them to be sold in the United States, including cigarettes intended to be sold in the United States through an importer (except where such importer is an original participating manufacturer (as that term is defined in the Master Settlement Agreement) that will be responsible for the payments under the Master Settlement Agreement with respect to such cigarettes as a result of the provisions of subsection II(mm) of the Master Settlement Agreement and that pays the taxes specified in subsection II(z) of the Master Settlement Agreement, and provided that the manufacturer of [the] SUCH cigarettes does not market or advertise the cigarettes in the United States);

(ii) is the first purchaser anywhere for resale in the United States of cigarettes manufactured anywhere that the manufacturer does not intend to be sold in the United States; or

(iii) becomes a successor of an entity described in subparagraph (i) or (ii) of this paragraph or paragraph (2) of this subsection.
