

TO 15 UG/DL, it shall be presumed that the ingestion of lead occurred before a person at risk began residing or regularly spending at least 24 hours per week in the affected property.

6-846.

(a) A local health department that receives the results of a blood lead test under § 6-303 of this title indicating that a person at risk has an EBL greater than or equal to 15 ug/dl BEFORE FEBRUARY 24, 2006, OR GREATER THAN OR EQUAL TO 10 UG/DL ON OR AFTER FEBRUARY 24, 2006, shall notify:

(1) The person at risk, or in the case of a minor, the parent of the person at risk, of the results of the test; and

(2) The owner of the affected property in which the person at risk resides or regularly spends at least 24 hours per week of the results of the test.

(b) The notices to be provided to the parent or owner under subsection (a) of this section shall be on the forms prepared by the Department, and shall contain any information required by the Department.

6-850.

(a) Except as provided in § 6-849 of this subtitle, in addition to any other remedies provided in this subtitle, the provisions and procedures of §§ 7-256 through 7-264 and 7-266(b) of this article shall be used and shall apply to enforce violations of this subtitle, provided that the penalty imposed under § 7-266(b)(2)(i) of this article may not exceed \$250 per day for any violation of this subtitle [which is not cured within 20 days after receipt of notice of the violation by the owner].

(b) If an accredited supervisor falsely verifies that work was performed on an affected property pursuant to § 6-819(f) of this subtitle, the owner of the affected property who employs the supervisor and who has actual knowledge of the false verification shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$15,000.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2005.
