

- (3) computerized physician order entry; ~~and~~
- (4) the cost of implementing items (1) through (3) of this subsection in the State;
- (5) the impact of the current and potential expansion on school health records; and
- (6) the impact of the current and potential expansion on patient safety.
- (g) The Task Force shall report its findings to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly on or before December 31, ~~2006~~ 2007.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2005. It shall remain effective for a period of ~~1 year~~ 2 years and 6 months and, at the end of December 31, ~~2006~~ 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

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**CHAPTER 292**

**(Senate Bill 265)**

AN ACT concerning

**Assisted Living Programs - Criteria for Requiring Manager Training**

FOR the purpose of altering the criteria used to determine whether certain managers of assisted living programs are required to complete a manager training course and continuing education that meets certain requirements; and generally relating to training requirements for assisted living managers.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

**Article - Health - General**

19-1807.

(a) (1) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this section, by January 1, 2006, an assisted living manager who is employed by an assisted living program that is licensed for [17] 5 or more beds shall have completed a manager training course that is approved by the Department and includes an examination.
