

(1) study and make recommendations regarding the establishment of a Prescription Drug Repository Program in the State, including:

- (i) types of drugs that may be donated to the Program;
- (ii) types of drugs that may not be donated to the Program;
- (iii) who may donate drugs to the Program;
- (iv) entities that may receive drugs for distribution;
- (v) standards and procedures for accepting, storing, and dispensing donated drugs;
- (vi) eligibility requirements for individuals wishing to receive donated drugs;
- (vii) standards and procedures for inspecting donated drugs;
- (viii) the appropriate entity to operate the Program;
- (ix) liability issues;
- (x) fees; and
- (xi) any other matter relating to the establishment of a Prescription Drug Repository Program; and

(2) report its findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, the General Assembly, on or before January 1, 2006.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect ~~October~~ July 1, 2005. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30, 2006, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

**CHAPTER 311**

**(Senate Bill 453)**

AN ACT concerning

**Cecil County - Solicitation of Money or Donations from Occupants of Vehicles - Prohibitions and Exceptions**

FOR the purpose of prohibiting, in Cecil County, a person from standing, or causing, encouraging, allowing, or petitioning another to stand, in a roadway, median divider, or intersection to solicit money or donations from the occupant of a vehicle, subject to a certain exception; authorizing the County Commissioners of Cecil County or the governing body of a municipal corporation in Cecil County to
