EDUCATE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS, BUSINESSES, MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS, AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC AS TO PARKING LAWS AND REGULATIONS, INCLUDING:

- (1) THE AUTHORITY OF LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS TO ENTER PRIVATE PARKING LOTS USED BY THE PUBLIC; AND
- (2) SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR, AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE LAWFUL USE OF, SPECIAL REGISTRATION PLATES AND PLACARDS ISSUED UNDER TITLE 13, SUBTITLE 6 OF THIS ARTICLE FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH DISABILITIES.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That a local legislative body shall provide for exceptions to local zoning ordinances under Section 1 of this Act to comply with the van-accessible parking ratio requirement of the Maryland Accessibility Code in the review and revision of its comprehensive zoning plan next occurring after the effective date of this Act.

<u>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That</u> this Act shall take effect October 1, 2005 January 1, 2006.
